Errata & Additional Information

- p10 The Primavera Gallery was founded in 1946 in Sloane St, London, by Henry Rothschild to showcase the best in British and other art and craft. It soon became highly important, and helped launch or develop the careers of Bernard Leach, Lucie Rie, Ray Rinch (at Winchcombe Pottery), Harry & May Davis (at the Crowan Pottery), and the Cole brothers (at Rye Pottery). The 1950s saw exhibitions of fine textiles, furniture, glass, and folk art and craft from Peru, Mexico, Crete, Russia, and other countries. The company is now based in Cambridge and continues to showcase the work of the best British artists, designers and craftspeople.
- p11 The furnace was supplied by Sismey & Linforth, not Sismey & Lindforth
- p12 The factory opened in October 1961, not June 1961, with 20 employees, 8 of whom were apprentices. Each apprentice attended a glassblowing course at Foley Technical College, Stourbridge.
- p13 The photograph on the bottom right shows Tom MacBeath and Chick Young in front of the Sismey & Lindforth furnace, not the mechanical Lehr.
- p14 The glass on the shelves behind ÓBroin also includes trial ranges and shapes.
- p46 The cylindrical Cased Vases were originally named 'Lochalsh' by ÓBroin. The 10inch (25.5cm) high example cost £2 9s 6d in 1966. Loch Alsh is an Inner Hebridean sea inlet between the Isle of Skye and the North-Western Highlands.
- p52 Bottom right: this is a cut down version of the taller lampbase on p55, and was thus made using the same mould.
- p98 The manager of the King's Lynn factory was John Dowe, not John Dawe.
- p106 Emerald was launched by 1996, not 1986.

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
